Since 1933, when he was resident in Port Elizabeth, Mr. Hayman Levy has been interested in Country Clubs and has been working for them. Now, at last, after several disappointments, he sees the new Circle Country Club arising with himself to guide it. On 18th April, Mr. Levy was elected as first Chairman, an honour which was his due for, in the words of D.J.C. President, Mr. N. E. Abrahams, "it was due to Mr. Levy's personal toil and to his driving force and faith, that the scheme eventually came about." Much remains to be done, but Mr. Levy will do it!

In P.E., Mr. Levy tried to get such a Club going in 1933, but circumstances were against the venture. Another start was made in 1938 with Hayman Levy as Chairman, but again world events intervened. The seed was sown, however, and today P.E. boasts the magnificent Wedgwood Park Country Club, founded in 1944 in which year Mr. Devy Carrie to Durbary ught 1811000

His time has been fully occupied in these years for the has done more besides getting the Country Club going. Chairman of the local branch of the Zionist Revisionist Party he has served—and still serves—on the Zionist Council for Natal and on the Executive. He is, too, a member of the Executive of the Council of Natal Jewry. He has held office, too, as Vice-Chairman of

the Committee of the Falmud Torah (Durban United Hebrew Schools).

Mr. Levy still sits on the Club Executive and was for a time Vice-Chairman of Finance.

It is quite a formidable record of achievement for one who has been in Durban for only 7 years and it augurs well for the future of the Circle Country Club.
